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## Preface

Since 1971, members of the political science institutes at the universities of Aarhus and Copenhagen have conducted interview surveys in connection with every parliamentary election in Denmark. The election on 21 September 1994 was the eleventh to be covered by a survey in this research tradition. Like the previous surveys, it has been sponsored by the Danish Social Science Research Council. The interviewing was carried out by the Danish Gallup Bureau in two rounds, October and November 1994, by means of personal interviewing in a cluster sampling design. With a response rate of 60 percent, the survey yielded around 1,000 completed interviews in each round.

This report contains the results of the survey in the form of a codebook to the SPSS system file DENM94.SYS. The SPSS system file contains 415 variables and takes up 941.608 bytes in compressed format. These data are unweighted. The complete database, however, contains several weight variables, district variables, and a number of other variables that appeared in the questionnaire but have been left out in the present English version.
