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Preface

After the general election in Denmark on 11 March 1998, staff members of the political science departments at the universities of Aalborg, Aarhus and Copenhagen conducted a survey of some 2,000 voters. This was the twelfth survey of consecutive general elections in Denmark since 1971, when the project began, and like its predecessors it was sponsored by the Danish Social Research Council. The interviewing was carried out as personal interviews by A.C. Nielsen-AIM during the period from the election to the beginning of June 1998, and obtained a response rate of 59 per cent.

The present working paper contains a translated version of the questionnaire with variable numbers and unweighted marginal distributions of the respondents. Some variables, mainly open-ended questions, the responses to which are yet to be coded, are left out in the paper and the temporary SPSS file "Denm98.sys" or "Denm98.sav", from which the paper was produced.
